- **Reason** Project will fund a Drainage study to provide alternatives to address a flood prone area on Route 122 in West Haven by the exit 43 off-ramp of I-95.

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) authorized the Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT) program in order to provide funds for resilience improvements to address current and future weather events, natural disasters, and changing conditions. A consultant will work with DOT staff to assess possible drainage improvements in West Haven on Route 122 by the exit 43 off-ramp of I-95. The flooding is a result of insufficient channel capacity and high tide. The funding will be utilized to seek a solution to reduce the frequency of flooding within the project area. Planning activities will include but are not limited to the following: interdepartmental coordination, development and gathering of climate projection data, engineering analysis, economic analysis, and generating a final report of alternative solutions.

- Whereas: U.S. Department of Transportation "Metropolitan Planning Regulations" (23 CFR 450) prescribe that each metropolitan planning organization maintain a financially constrained multi-modal transportation improvement program consistent with a State Implementation Plan for Air Quality (SIP) conforming to both U.S. Environmental Protection Administration-established air quality guidelines and SIP-established mobile source emissions budgets; and
- Whereas: The Council, per 23 CFR 450.324 and in cooperation with the Connecticut Department of Transportation (ConnDOT) and public transit operators and relying upon financial constraints offered by ConnDOT, adopted a Fiscal Year 2021-Fiscal Year 2024 Transportation Improvement Program on September 23, 2020, after finding the Program conforming per U.S. Environmental Protection Administration (U.S. EPA) final conformity rule (40 CFR 51 and 93) and relevant Connecticut Department of Transportation air quality conformity determinations: Air Quality Conformity Reports: Fiscal Year 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program and the Region's Metropolitan Transportation Plans—2023 to 2050, (April, 2023); and
- Whereas: The Council, on September 23, 2020, indicated that periodic Program adjustment or amendment was possible; and
- *Whereas:* Projects referenced in the Program amendment (below) are consistent with the region's metropolitan transportation plan *Metropolitan Transportation Plans*—2023 to 2050, (*April, 2023*); and
- *Whereas:* Council *Public Participation Guidelines: Transportation Planning* have been observed during the development of the proposed *Program* amendment (below); and
- *Whereas*: By agreement between the Council and the Connecticut Department of Transportation, public involvement activities carried out by the South Central Regional Council of Governments in response to U.S. Department of Transportation metropolitan planning requirements are intended to satisfy the requirements associated with development of a *Statewide Transportation Improvement Program* and/or its amendment; and
- *Whereas:* Council of Governments' review of transportation goals, projects and opportunities may result in further adjustment or amendment of the *Program*.
