## Action Item #2: Annual Endorsement of CTDOT Targets for Safety Performance Measures

J Rode introduced CTDOT's Safety Performance Measures and the specific performance "target" for each measure. CTDOT is maintaining the targets that were set last year. Following a discussion, A Kapushinski made a motion to recommend approval of the performance targets. Mayor Borer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

## 2025-2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM - Amendment Number 5

## Project 0014-0189 - REPLACE COMPUTERIZED TRAFFIC SIGNAL

**Changes:** Amendment 5 decreases funding amount.

**Reason:** Replacement of the Computerized Traffic Signal System (CTSS) along U.S. Route 1 in Branford/East Haven from Beaver Road (Int. No. 014-203) in Branford to Main Street in East Haven (Int. No. 043-208). This project is needed to replace the aging traffic signal infrastructure, as needed for a state of good repair, by replacing the existing CTSS. The replacement of the CTSS will involve new fiber technologies to monitor and reduce travel times. PE phase includes a PD/FD split.

# Project 0043-0133 - MODERN ROUNDABOUT AT US 1 & CT 100

Changes: Amendment 5 updates the project scope

**Reason:** The project scope has changed from Rock Slope Stabilization to a Modern

Roundabout.

# Project 0061-0153 - WALKABLE SIDEWALK PED/BIKE IMPROVEMENTS

**Changes:** Amendment 5 updates the funding source.

Reason: Adjust existing projects for revised cost estimates. No change to total project

cost.



# Project 0075-0140 - CONVERT EXISTING COMMUTER LOT TO TRUCK PARKING AREA

**Changes:** Amendment 5 new project proposed.

Reason: Convert the existing commuter parking lot located at the I-95/Route 79 interchange in Madison to a truck parking area, including provisions for an amenity building, associated utilities, drainage, and stormwater management. Truck parking shortages are a national concern affecting the safety of commercial motor vehicle drivers and other roadway users as well as the efficiency of U.S. supply chains. As part of the Connecticut Statewide Freight Plan Update, the Department of Transportation conducted a Statewide Truck Parking Study to identify potential locations for expanding and developing truck parking. This site was selected as a priority location to create new truck parking.

# Project 0092-0698 - CONSTRUCT TRAIL CONNECTING DOWNTOWN TO EAST SHORE NEIGHBORHOOD

**Changes:** Amendment 5 new project proposed.

**Reason:** Construct 4.5 mile trail connecting downtown New Haven to the East Shore neighborhood. Currently there is no bicycle infrastructure within New Haven's East Shore. This 4.5 mile trail will open up numerous connections for the community as well as complete New Haven's portion of the intercity Shoreline Greenway Trail. The trail will provide an easily accessible route for residents to travel from downtown for recreation and commuting purposes. The trail will connect to other existing and proposed trails and provide greater mobility for non-motorized transportation users.



# Project 0170-3640 - SERVICE PLAZA MAINLINE SIGN AND SIGN SUPPORT REPLACEMENT

Changes: Amendment 5 increases funding amount

Reason: Service Plaza mainline sign and sign support replacement along I-95 and I-395. The purpose of this project is to improve directional guidance to motorists seeking the use of a Service Plaza. This project will create a standard signing practice and enhance driver recognition utilizing additional Logo signing on the mainline approach to the Service Plazas. The PE phase includes a PD/FD split. PPI # PP170-0027. Per info contained on the PPI, FHWA confirmed this project is eligible for Federal reimbursement, with the exception of any specific corporate logos supplied by others. Additional info on the PPI indicates that CTDOT's Concessions and Agreements sections will be negotiating with Project Services (the plaza operator) to come to a cost sharing agreement for a portion of the project costs (likely applied to CN phase only). For purposes of the RPM, the CN phase is being shown as 100% Federally funded, but this may change following negotiations/outcome of cost sharing agreement. Traffic is responsible for coordinating with Finance to provide cost sharing information at the appropriate time. CN phase to draw funds from FY25 SIGN-PRES placeholder in OBL.

# Fiscal Year 2025-Fiscal Year 2028 Transportation Improvement Program Amendment Five

- Whereas: U.S. Department of Transportation "Metropolitan Planning Regulations" (23 CFR 450) prescribe that each metropolitan planning organization maintain a financially constrained multi-modal transportation improvement program consistent with a State Implementation Plan for Air Quality (SIP) conforming to both U.S. Environmental Protection Administration-established air quality guidelines and SIP-established mobile source emissions budgets; and
- Whereas: The Council, per 23 CFR 450.324 and in cooperation with the Connecticut Department of Transportation (ConnDOT) and public transit operators and relying upon financial constraints offered by ConnDOT, adopted a Fiscal Year 2025-Fiscal Year 2028 Transportation Improvement Program on April 24, 2024, after finding the Program conforming per U.S. Environmental Protection Administration (U.S. EPA) final conformity rule (40 CFR 51 and 93) and relevant Connecticut Department of Transportation air quality conformity determinations: Air Quality Conformity Reports: Fiscal Year 2025-2028Transportation Improvement Program and the Region's Metropolitan Transportation Plans—2023 to 2050, (April, 2023); and
- Whereas: The Council, on April 24, 2024, indicated that periodic Program adjustment or amendment was possible; and
- Whereas: Projects referenced in the Program amendment (below) are consistent with the region's metropolitan transportation plan Metropolitan Transportation Plans—2023 to 2050, (April 2023); and
- Whereas: Council Public Participation Guidelines: Transportation Planning have been observed during the development of the proposed Program amendment (below); and
- Whereas: By agreement between the Council and the Connecticut Department of Transportation, public involvement activities carried out by the South Central Regional Council of Governments in response to U.S. Department of Transportation metropolitan planning requirements are intended to satisfy the requirements associated with development of a Statewide Transportation Improvement Program and/or its amendment; and
